Deutsche Digitalen Bibliothek: assignment



- **Central point of access** to digital objects from cultural heritage and science facilities
 - Inter-disciplinary
 - cross media (archives, libraries, museums, medialibraries monument preservation, science)
- **National Data Aggregator** for Europeana
- **Cooperative network (joint venture)** of cultural heritage and research & science institutes (KWE) in Germany
 - promotes collaboration between its members
 - Serviceprovider for IT-tools, Workshops and general information
- **Platform** for data and services
 - Linked Open Data
 - open gateways and interfaces
 - data enrichment



Deutsche Digitale Bibliothek: target groups

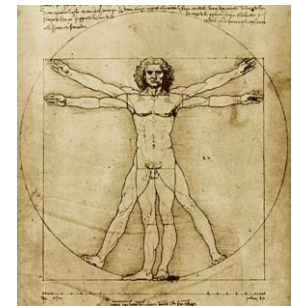
– General public

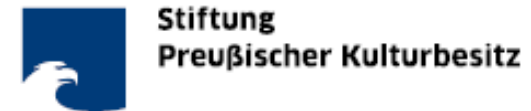

Legal Status – Deutsche Digitale Bibliothek



- a network of cultural and scientific institutions (supported by federal, state and local authorities)
- joint Bund-Länder project: the German federal government and German states
- not yet an independent legal entity



- the Prussian Cultural Heritage Foundation acts on behalf of the ‚Kompetenznetzwerk Deutsche Digitale Bibliothek‘
- ideas about establishing a legal corporation are in discussion
- in 2014: DDB has been evaluated by a scientific commission
- results will be integrated into the next steps of development

... Where comes the money from ?

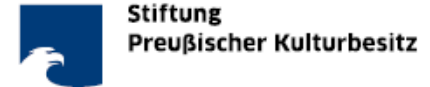
Funding from

- „Konjunkturprogramm II“ until end of 2011: **7,8 M€** (technical development, Fraunhofer IAIS, FIZ Karlsruhe)
- federal government and the 16 Laender: **2,6 M€/p.a.** (according to an agreement signed by ministers, run time: 2011-2015)
- the federal government in 2013: **1 M€** plus **0.3 M€** by Laender governments to proceed from beta to release state



Overall funding of 26.8 M€ since 2007

Organisational Structures



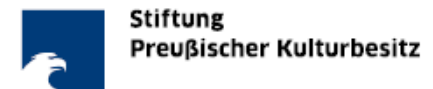
- **central administrative office**

- **domain specific service desks** cover all sectors of cultural content within the Deutsche Digitale Bibliothek :

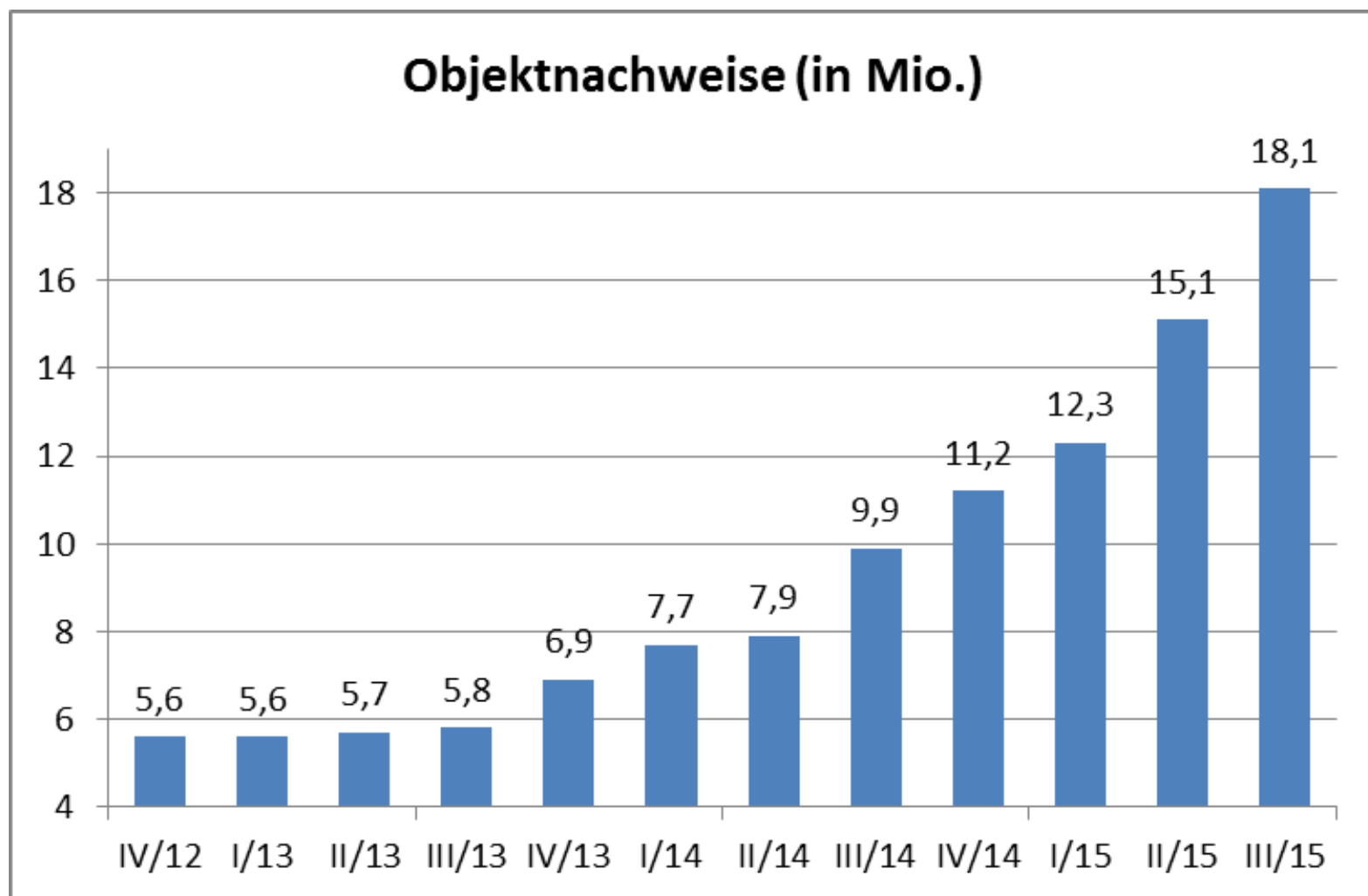

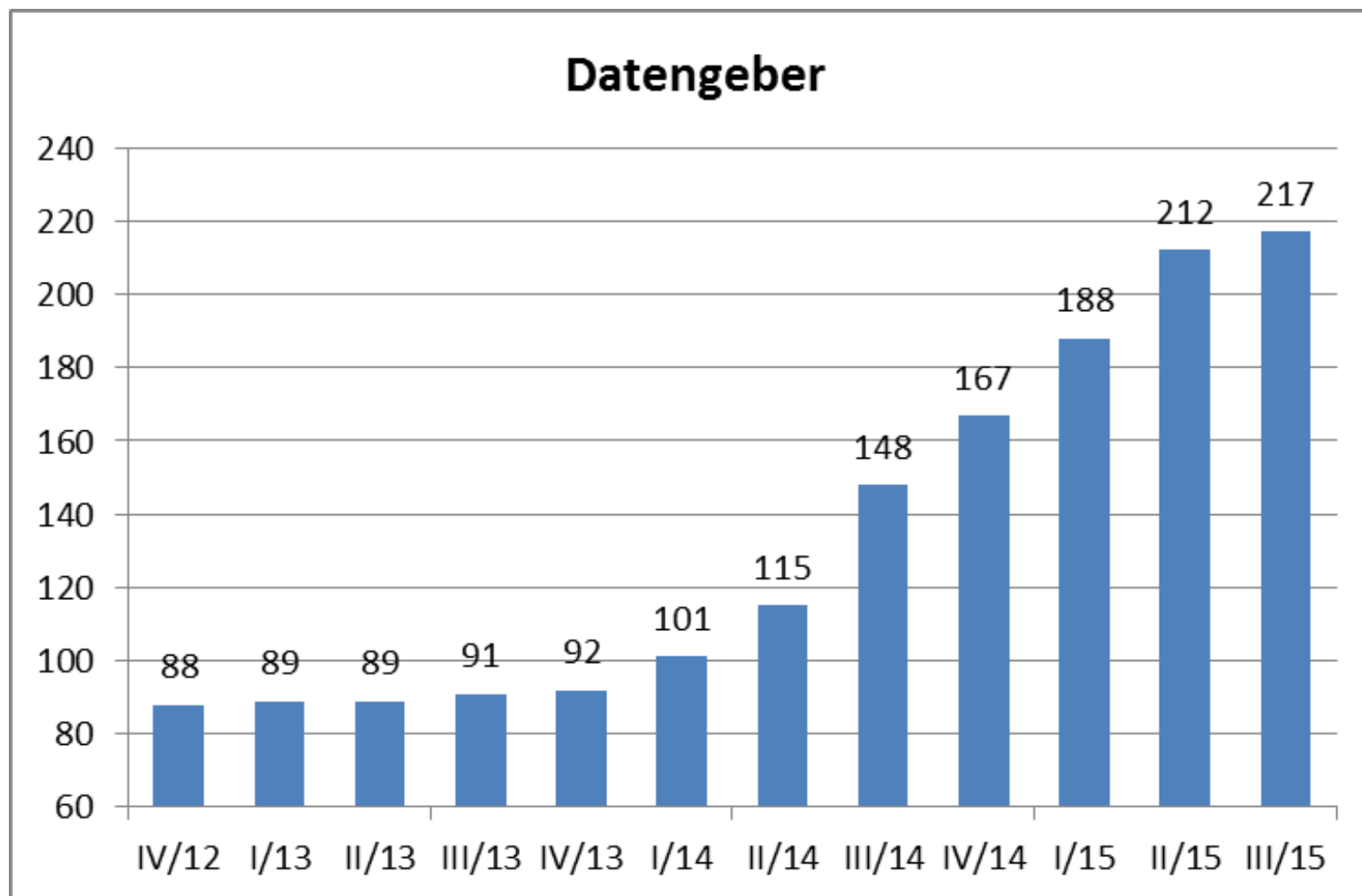

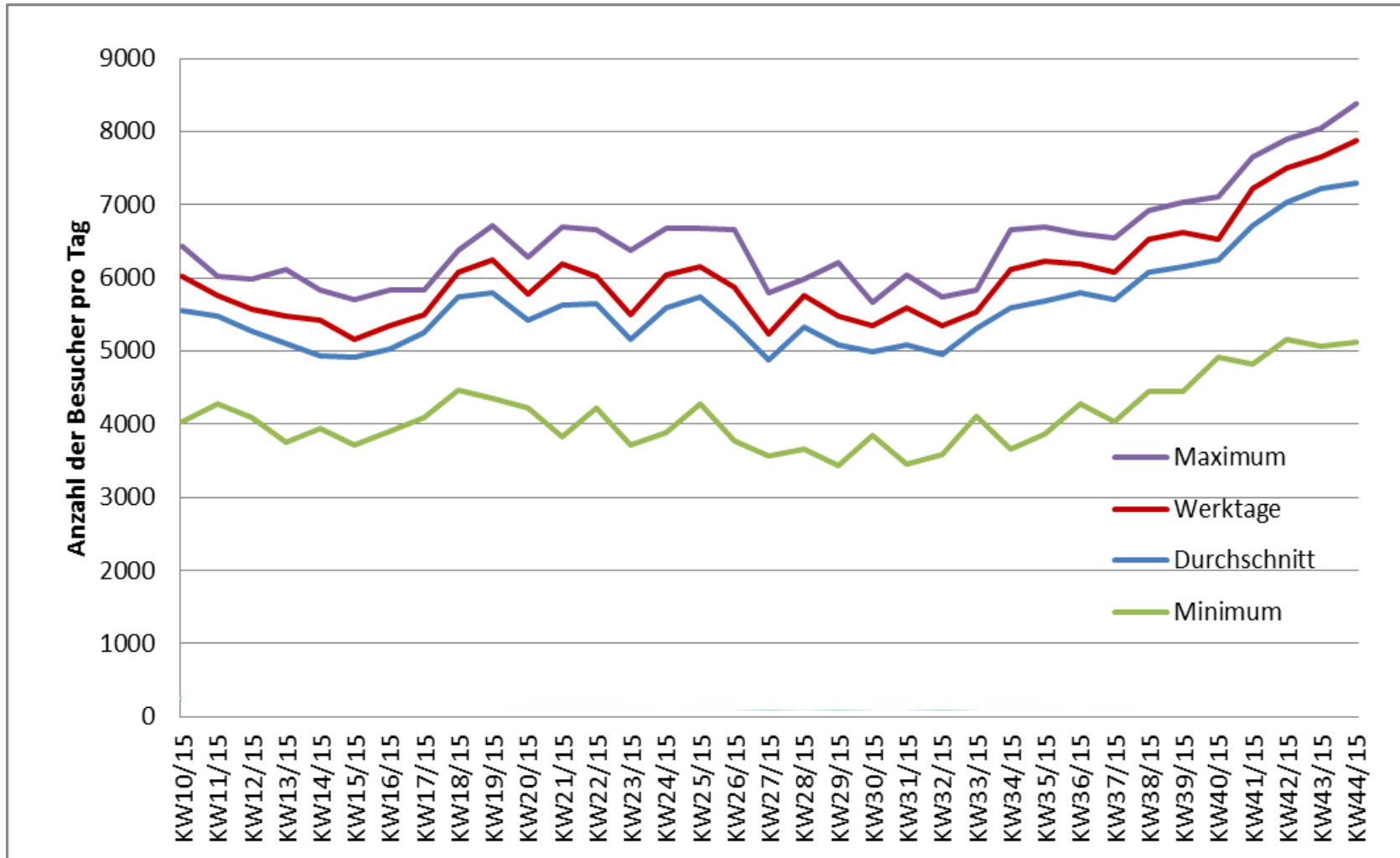
Growth of DDB content

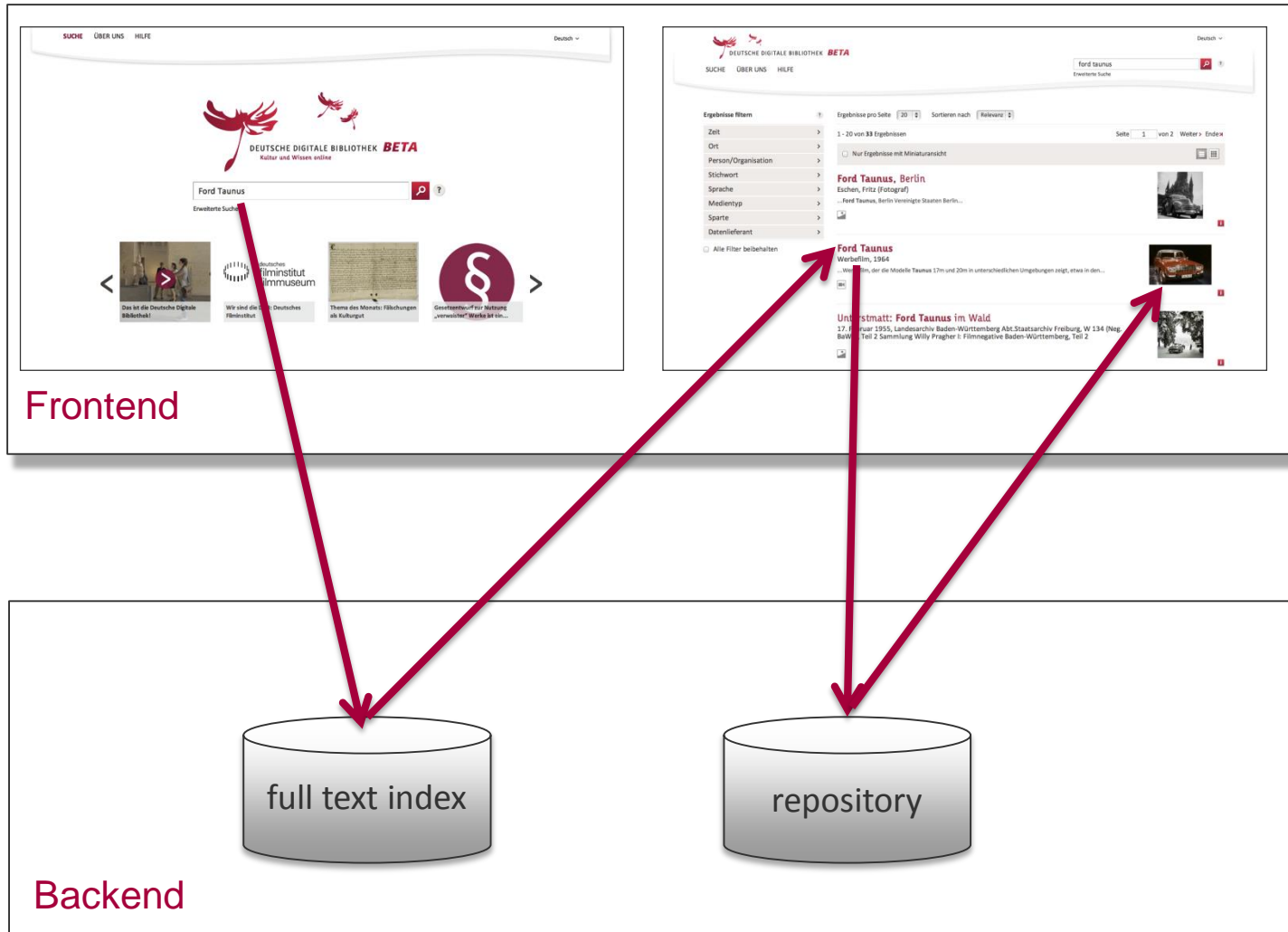

How it works - technical structure

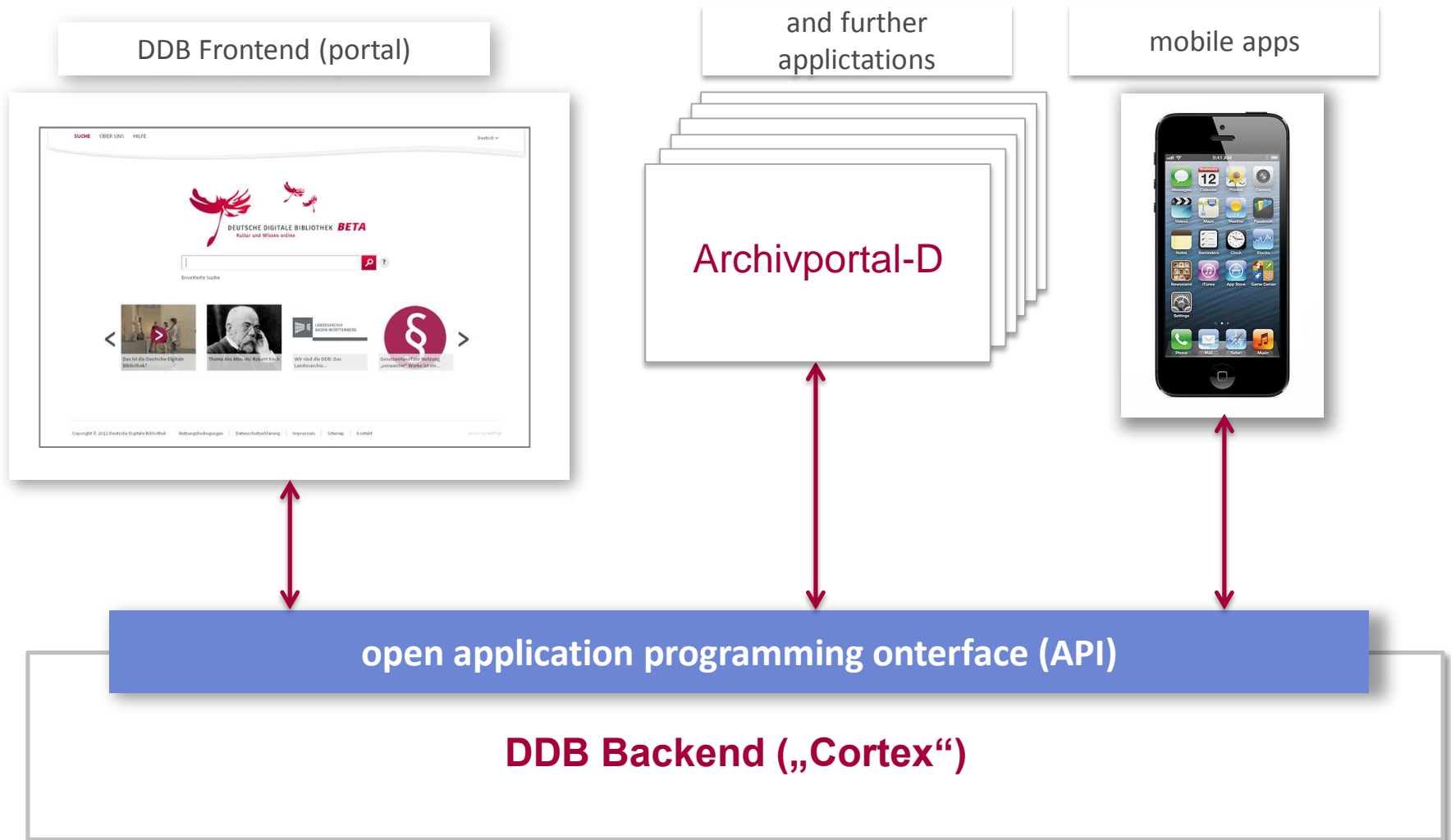


advanced search

The advanced search allows you to specify your search requests more precisely. You can define whether the results of the search terms, an exact phrase or all of the search terms. You can also select which fields you want to search

You open the advanced search by clicking the **Advanced search** link below the search field.

Overview of the advanced search elements

(2) List of the fields in which you can search. By selecting **Search all** you can search in all the fields.

(3) With the selection list to the right of a search field you specify how you want to search. You can choose from the following options:

- **One of the terms:**

The search result must contain at least one of the search terms.

- **All terms:** The search result must contain all search terms.
- **Exact phrase:** The search result must contain the search terms in exactly the specified order. You would typically use this option when you enter titles of works.
